### MCC's Huff is rewriting the books

Meridian Community College women's soccer head coach Mike Smith knew he was receiving a talented player when Meridian High School forward MeMe Huff committed to play for the Eagles in the spring. Smith, who doubles as the girls soccer coach at MHS, has coached Huff since she was eight years old. But, even he is still a little surprised with just how well his freshman forward has performed this season.

After two goals Saturday, including the game-winner in the Eagles' 3-2 overtime victory over Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, Huff increased her season total to 15 through seven games. The win brought the Eagles to 7-0 (3-0) on the season.

"Big-time players make plays in big-time games," Smith said after the win."

With 10 games remaining in the regular season, Huff is also on pace to shatter the MCC record for goals in a season at 27.

"I'm going for it," Huff said before Saturday's game. "I would really love for that to happen."

Despite the early success, Huff has been quick to deflect the spotlight, choosing instead to credit MCC's undefeated start to a full team effort.

"Kayla Phillips, one of our center mids from Clarkdale, she always places the ball perfectly where I can get it and just knock it in," Huff said.

"After I score the goal, if it's her assist, I always go to her and give her a hug because she did all the work. I just have to finish. Most of my goals were from her assists."

The Bulldogs' defense honed in on Huff on Saturday, keeping constant note of her whereabouts on the pitch and doubling her with the ball at her feet. Smith said he expects opposing defenses to continue to give her extra attention as the season goes on.

"She's a freshman, so the first time we play teams they don't know anything about her," he said. "I'm sure the second time we play these teams this year they'll be keying on MeMe. That should open some doors for other players."

If that's the case, Huff said she will be more than happy to dump the ball off to her teammates. Even as a freshman, Huff has stepped up as a leader for the Eagles this season. On top of her performance on the field, she also hosts a weekly bible study at her house every Monday night.

### MCC soccer splits at home

The Meridian Community College Lady Eagles entered its home match against Mississippi Gulf Coast having won its first six to open the 2013 season. The Lady Eagles needed overtime to slip past the Lady Bulldogs by a final score of 3-2 Saturday afternoon at C.D. Smith Field.

Former Meridian High star MeMe Huff propelled MCC to the victory with a goal in the second overtime session. Huff scored a goal in the first half for MCC to add to her already impressive total for the season. Huff now has 15 goals for the season and entered play Saturday ranked third in the

didn't take as long to respond this time, ripping off the next 35 points. McCarron tossed three touchdowns in the first half to put Alabama up 28-14. Sunseri's pick-6 made it 35-14 less than three minutes into the third.

Manziel was his spectacular self, throwing for a career-best 464 yards and five TDs. But a first-half interception in the end zone swung the game the Tide's way, and his third-

quarter pick and whiff on the tackle put the Aggies in a deep hole.

"I thought his play was Johnny-like," coach Kevin Sumlin said. "Anybody who's seen him play, that's about right."

Alabama's best defense was its offense. The Tide gained 568 yards and kept Manziel pacing on the sideline with a

## Marshall's last play TD lifts Auburn over Miss. State

AUBURN, Ala. — Nick Marshall hit C.J. Uzomah for an 11-yard touchdown with 10 seconds left to lift Auburn to a 24-20 victory over Mississippi State on Saturday night, ending the Tigers' 10-game Southeastern Conference losing streak.

Marshall led the

Tigers (3-0, 1-0 SEC) down the field with big running and passing plays in easily his best game.

The junior-college transfer completed his first five passes for 55 yards in leading Auburn 88 yards over the final 1:56. He then ran 11 yards on 3rd-and-10 before lofting the decisive throw to the right corner of the end zone.

The play was reviewed and instant replay officials ruled that the 6-foot-4 tight end, Uzomah, was pushed out of bounds, enabling him to come back.

Subbing for an injured Tyler Russell for a second straight game, quarterback Dak Prescott ran for 133 yards and two touchdowns and

passed for 213 for Mississippi State (1-2, 0-1). Russell sustained a concussion in the opener against Oklahoma State.

With the game on the line, Marshall suddenly looked like anything but a guy who's had six weeks to learn an offense.

He hit freshman Marcus Davis on three straight passes to cover 29 yards, then had a 17-yarder to Jaylon Denson.

He also salvaged short gains with a couple of

runs before heading out of bounds.

Tre Mason's 3-yard run pushed it to the 11 before Auburn called

timeout with 15 seconds left.

Marshall was 23-of-34 passing for

339 yards and two touchdowns but was intercepted twice. He passed for just 246 yards and two TDs in his first two games as starter combined.

Marshall showed a knack for turning potential miscues into big plays. He dropped the shotgun snap,

collected it on the bounce and hit a wide-open Quan Bray downfield for a
